ADMISSION FORMALITIES

ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA FOR VARIOUS COURSES

BACHELOR OF PHARMACY (1ST YEAR)

Senior School Certificate Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi (12 year Course) or the Indian School Examination with 60% or above marks* in aggregate in the three Science subjects (Physics, Chemistry and Biology) from Recognized Schools in the Union Territory of Delhi.

OR

Any other examination (12 year course) recognized by Indian University or Board with minimum of 60% marks* in the aggregate of the compulsory subjects namely, Physics, Chemistry and Biology.

OR

Intermediate examination in science with 60% and above marks* in aggregate in the three Science subjects (Physics, Chemistry and Biology)

Candidates who have been awarded grades in the examination which make them eligible for admission should also submit

conversion certificate of numerical marks from the concerned authority. The candidates who have passed 10+2 Examination from **Open School** are **NOT ELIGIBLE** for admission to B. Pharm. 1st year.

DIPLOMA IN PHARMACY (2 YEARS COURSE)

Candidates seeking admission to Diploma in Pharmacy must have passed any of the following examinations.

Senior School Certificate Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi (12 years course)/ Indian School Examination With 60% and above marks* in aggregate in the three science subjects (Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Maths) from recognized schools in the Union Territory of Delhi.

OR

Any other examination (12 year course) recognized by Indian University or Board with minimum of 60% marks* in the aggregate of the compulsory subjects namely, Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Mathematics.

OR

Intermediate examination in science with 60% and above marks* in aggregate in the Science subjects (Physics, Chemistry and Biology or Maths). No equivalence or Hr. Sec (Vocational Stream) will be considered for admission to D. Pharm. 1st year. The candidates who have passed 10+2 examination from **Open School** are **NOT ELIGIBLE** for admission to D. Pharm course.

AGE REQUIREMENT FOR ADMISSION TO B. PHARM. 1ST YEAR & D. PHARM. 1ST YEAR

No Candidate shall be qualified for admission to the course below seventeen years of age before the first day of October, of the year he/ she seeks admission.

Candidates born on/or before 30th September, 1998 are eligible to apply for admission to the course. The Vice-Chancellor may, however, on the basis of individual merit relax the age limit up to a maximum period of one year.

B. PHARM. 2ND YEAR (Subject To The Availability Of Seats)

Candidates seeking admission to 2nd year B. Pharmacy course having passed the (i) Diploma course in Pharmacy (two years) from University of Delhi will be eligible for admission to 2nd year of Degree Course strictly in order of merit i.e both in theory and practical together. There will be no reservation of any category for these seats.

The candidate who will be admitted to the B. Pharm. 2nd year course will have to pass the following additional papers viz. Mathematics, Basic Electronics and Computer Science of B. Pharm 1st year.

Candidates born on or before 30th September, 1998 are eligible for admission to the course

M. PHARM. COURSES

1. Minimum eligibility for admission to M. Pharm. Course (Pharmacology, Pharmaceutics, Hospital Pharmacy, Quality Assurance, Clinical Research, Pharmaceutical Chemistry, Herbal Drug Technology, Pharmaceutical Management)

Candidate seeking admission to the M. Pharm, course must have passed the Bachelor of Pharmacy examination with at

least 50% in the aggregate of theory and practical papers of II, III and IV year from University of Delhi or equivalent there to. GPAT QUALIFIED CANDIDATES SHALL BE CONSIDERED FOR ADMISSION FIRST. In case GPAT candidates are not available, NON GPAT candidates can be considered for admission, on the basis of merit.

2. Basis of Selection

First 15% of the total seats i.e. 7 seats will be filled by Non-DU Candidates with valid GPAT score and completed B. Pharm examination with 50% from recognized University as equivalent. The non DU candidates will be allowed to choose their 7 seats first from the 8 branches not exceeding 1 seat in each branch.

Remaining 85% of the total seats will be filled by graduates of University of Delhi with valid GPAT score in order of preference of disciplines. The merit list of candidates for admission to 85% seats from DU with scholarship will be in accordance with the following criteria:

- 50% weightage for marks in both theory & practical
- 50% weightage for GPAT score

In each branch first 15% seats for non-DU students- 100% GPAT score will be the criteria. In case of more than one candidate with the same score, preference will be given to the candidate who is older in age. In case no GPAT students available in 15% Non-Delhi category, then student from Delhi category with GPAT will be considered.

In case sufficient number of DU students are not available against the 85% of seats, the seats will go to non-DU students with valid GPAT score. After exhaustion of non-DU GPAT qualified candidates, if seats still remain vacant they will be offered to DU-NON GPAT applicants. Further, if seats still remain vacant the

non Delhi University, NON GPAT can be considered, if possible. Allocation of branches will be made for the DU category after the admission is over and change of order of preference will be decided subject to availability of seats in the branch with respect to the merit of the applicant at that time. Any seat vacated by any student in any branch after the admission will be reallocated as per the merit in the respective category.

3. Age Requirement

Candidates seeking admission to M. Pharm. course must be more than 21 of age before the 1st day of October, in which he/ she seeks admission. Candidates born on or before 30th September, 1994 are eligible to apply for admission.

4. Duration

The course will commence from 01-8-2015 to 31-7-2017. Scholarship to the maximum period of 24 months will be paid during the session as approved by Ministry of Human Resource Development to those who have qualified GPAT examination. One academic year will be devoted by each student for research leading to thesis.

5. Grant of Fellowship (To be governed by rules of AICTE)

The following terms and conditions will govern the grant of scholarship:

- a. M. Pharm is a full-time course (i.e, minimum from 9:00 AM to 6:00 PM, in week).
- b. It will be obligatory for every postgraduate student to undertake 8-10 hours (per week) of work related to teaching and research activities as assigned to him/her by the institute. This could include UG teaching assistance in the form of conducting tutorials, laboratory classes, development and maintenance of laboratories, assistance

in research and development activities undertaken by faculty members, maintenance and operation of computers and other central facilities, assistance in library etc.

- c. Whenever the Government of India/University Grants Commission/Council of Scientific and Industrial Research/ Industry sponsored or AICTE funded projects are being undertaken, the services of the students may be used for providing assistance in these projects. In that event a portion of scholarship amount i.e. Rs. 1500/- per month for the time being will be charged to the project funds for the duration the students are engaged on these projects. The institute will workout specific program and maintain the record of such students.
- d. During the course of studies, the student shall not receive any emoluments, salary, stipend etc. from any other source.
- e. In no case will the scholarship be allowed for a period of more than 24 months.
- f. No house rent allowance (HRA) is admissible to the student receiving scholarship.
- g. The student shall be eligible for medical facilities as per institute/college rules.
- h. Foreign students and students admitted under sponsored category will not be eligible for these scholarships.
- i. The student shall be entitled for leave for a maximum period of 30 days per year in addition to general holidays but is not entitled to vacations i.e. summer, winter, etc.
- j. The students who are admitted to AICTE approved M. Pharm level courses will only be eligible to receive the scholarship. Provided they are qualified in GPAT.

- k. The students have to provide an undertaking that they shall abide by the above mentioned clauses.
- l. A student shall be required to give an affidavit to the effect that he/she would not leave the course midway or appear in any competitive examination in order to be eligible to receive this scholarship. In case the student leaves the course midway, he/she will have to return the drawn fellowship amount with 18% interest.
- m. The AICTE/Institute/University of Delhi may impose any other conditions as deemed necessary from time to time.
- n. As per Pharmacy Ordinance, the students are required to have minimum 75% of attendance (both in theory and practical) to be eligible to appear in final examination.

6. Submission of Application and Display of Merit List

The final merit list for all categories of M. Pharm. will be displayed on the Notice Board/Website within 30 days after the declaration of B. Pharm results by University of Delhi. Admission to various courses will be offered to the candidates strictly according to the order of merit given in the merit list.

PH. D. PROGRAMME

Admission into Ph.D program will be made as per the ordinance of University of Delhi which will be advertised separately. Three seats for AICTE sponsored candidates under QIP scheme for sponsored teacher candidates, in various discipline of Pharmacy under Delhi University are available in the Institute.

Besides this, preference in admission to Ph. D. will be given to candidates who are awarded fellowship from any other

recognized funding agency like UGC, CSIR, HRD, ICMR, DS&T, AICTE, AYUSH, DRDO, DBT Ministry of Health, or a private agency etc. The institute will engage the Ph.D scholars for teaching of Undergraduate classes.

RESERVATIONS

Provision for Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe/Other Backward Class Candidates

22.5% of the total number of seats (15% for Scheduled Castes and 7.5% for Scheduled Tribes) of the course are reserved for Scheduled Caste and Scheduled Tribe candidates. 27% of seats within Delhi category are reserved for OBC students. In case of non availability of ST candidates, the seats available are to be converted to SC category. In case non-availability of OBC the seats to be converted to general category.

Each Scheduled Caste/Scheduled Tribe candidate who has passed the qualifying examination for the course concerned may be given 5% relaxation. If the reserved seat still remains vacant, further relaxation shall be given to the extent required in order to fill up all the reserved seats.

*A Scheduled Caste / Scheduled Tribe candidate while applying for registration for any of the course will be required to submit a verified certificate to the effect that he/ she belongs to Scheduled caste/ Scheduled Tribe, from the competent authority with the application form. Delhi category students have to produce caste certificate (SC/ST/OBC) from appropriate authority of Govt. of Delhi as given below. The non-Delhi SC/ ST candidates have to produce the caste certificate from the following competent authority of their respective state. These certificates will be duly verified by the Admission Officer.

- (i) District Magistrate/Additional District Magistrate/Deputy Commissioner/Collector/Additional Deputy Commissioner/Deputy Collector/1st Class Stipendiary Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner
- (ii) Chief Presidency Magistrate/ Additional Chief Presidency Magistrate/Presidency Magistrate
- (iii) Revenue Officer not below the rank of Tehsildar. Class Stipendiary Magistrate/Extra Assistant Commissioner
- (iv) Sub- Divisional Officer of the area where the candidate and /or his/her family normally resides.
- (v) Administrator/Secretary to Administrator/Development Officer (Lakshwadeep and Minicoy Island).

As per Academic resolution No.23 dated 16.5.2001 and 4.7.2001 of University of Delhi, no seats shall be reserved for SC/ST in M. Pharm course where the number of seats is less than 7 in each discipline.

Provision for Children/Widows of the Officers and men of the Armed forces including paramilitary personnel killed or disabled during hostilities and also who died on duty (Defence Category).

- (i) the Children/Widows of the officers and men of the Armed Forces including paramilitary personnel killed or disabled during hostilities and also who died in duty will be given concession of 5% marks in the minimum eligibility conditions as per rules of University of Delhi.
- (ii) Children /Widows of Officers and men of the Armed Forces including para-military personnel who died while on duty will be considered for admission against 5% seats for all the Armed forces including paramilitary personnel, killed or disabled in action in wars 1947-48 onwards.

*Reservation subject to circular communicated by Delhi Government

In the above 2 categories seats will be offered in the following order of preference: (If no such candidates available the seats to be filled by candidates of general category)

- i. Widows/Wards of Defence-paramilitary personnel killed in action.
- ii. Wards of serving personnel and Ex-servicemen disabled in action.
- iii. Widows/Wards of Defence-Paramilitary personnel who died in peace time
- iv. Wards of Defence-Paramilitary personnel who were disabled in peace time with disability attributable to military service.
- v. Wards of Ex-servicemen and serving personnel who are in receipt of Gallantry Awards:-
 - a. Param Vir Chakra
 - b. Ashok Chakra
 - c. Sarvottam Yudh Seva medal
 - d. MahaVir Chakra
 - e. Kirti Chakra
 - f. Uttam Yudh Seva medal
 - g. Vir Chakra
 - h. Shaurya Chakra
 - i. Yudh Seva medal
 - j. Sena, Nausena, Vayusena medal
- vi. Wards of ex-serving personnel.
- vii. Wards of serving personnel.

In order to become eligible for the above concession the widows/children of officers and men of Armed Forces including paramilitary personnel will be required to produce an entitlement certificate from any one of the following authorities.

Admissions of students to various courses in academic session 2015-16 in view of the OBC reservations

The reservation of seats for OBC candidates, if any, will be implemented in accordance with the reservation policy of the Delhi Government. In accordance with the above, the following procedure for admission of the OBC candidates to Under-graduate courses will be followed. It is re-iterated that the OBC candidates under Delhi Category who belong to the 'Non-Creamy Layer' and whose castes appear in the Delhi List of the OBCs only shall be eligible to be considered for admission under the Delhi-OBC Category on producing certificate from appropriate authority only. The unfilled OBC seats available are to be converted to general category.

1. In accordance with the Cabinet decision No.1869 dtd 27/2/12, the percentage of reservation for OBC students will be 27% in the academic year 2015-16.
2. The OBC candidates shall be given a relaxation in the minimum eligibility in the qualifying examination to the extent of 5% of the minimum eligibility marks prescribed for the General Category Candidates.
3. All those OBC candidates who meet the minimum eligibility marks in the qualifying examination shall be eligible for

admission in the order of their merit, keeping in view the availability of seats reserved for them.

4. If the seats reserved for the OBC remain vacant, the said seats shall be filled with the OBC students. Only if OBC candidates possessing the minimum eligibility marks are not available in the OBC category then the vacant OBC seats shall be converted into General Category seats in accordance with the admission schedule notified by the University.

Candidates belonging to State where there is no Diploma Course in Pharmacy

Candidate from state where there is no government Diploma Course in Pharmacy will be admitted against one seat reserved for such States.

Such candidates must have passed the Qualifying Examination from the State to which they belong and must be nominated by the State Government concerned on the allocation made by the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Deptt. of Education, Government of India, to the Director, Training and Technical Education, Muni Mayaram Marg, Pitampura Delhi-34

Last Date for receipts of such application will be 07-07-2015.

Foreign National And Candidates Belonging To The Countries/States Where There Is No Degree Institute In Pharmacy

One seat for candidates from other States, where there is no government Degree college in Pharmacy will be reserved provided they fulfill the minimum eligibility conditions laid down in this behalf.

The foreign nationals must fulfill the eligibility conditions for the admission to the course. The application must be processed

through Foreign Student's Advisor of the University of Delhi as per the rules and fees existing for foreign students. The applicant has to submit the copy of the application to university of Delhi directly. Any foreign student application submitted at DIPSAR has to be forwarded to the foreign student Adviser, University of Delhi for processing. These seats are supernumerary and not exceeding 5% of total intake. Supernumerary seats for Kashmiri migrant students as per AICTE norms.

The candidates from the states where there is no government Degree College in Pharmacy must have passed the qualifying examination from the state to which they belong. If no such candidate available the seats is to be allotted to General category of Non-Delhi category.

HANDICAPPED STUDENTS

The physically handicapped students are advised to get themselves registered with Dean, Student Welfare, North Campus, University of Delhi in order to consider their cases for admission to Under-Graduate courses. These seats are supernumerary and maximum upto 3%.

No further extension shall be given and applications received after the last date of submission shall not be entertained.

The fee for Different category of Delhi University sponsored seats i.e foreign national admissions will be collected as per the rules of University of Delhi.

The fees and other charges mentioned in the prospectus may be revised by the Institute any time without notice. In the event of such revision, all the enrolled students shall pay at the revised rates.

HOSTEL

The institute has well-furnished six hostel accommodation two for boys and two for girls. Presently, it is available for outside Delhi candidates only. However, in future it is targeted to provide hostel accommodation to over 50% of the students.

REFUND OF FEES

The refund of fees paid at the time of admission or during the course is governed by AICTE norms. Any claim for refund of Caution fee should be made within three years of completion of course along with original receipt, else the fee will be forfeited and returned to Government Account.

PAYMENT OF DUES

All dues shall be cleared by the dates mentioned in the prospectus or as notified by the Director/Dean, from time to time.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

The detailed rules and regulation on the subject may be obtained from the office of the Institute. The financial assistance, available to students of full time courses, in accordance with relevant rules, are as follows:

FEE CONCESSIONS

Scholarship Holders: Scholarship holders shall be exempted from payment of Tuition fee, on application.

Sister/brother Concession : In case two or more brothers/sisters are admitted in the institute the brother/sister studying in the lower class shall pay half the prescribed Tuition fee.

No Tuition fee shall be charged from son or daughter of employees of Training and Technical Education.

SC and ST students: Students belonging to the Scheduled Castes/Tribes shall be exempted from payment of tuition fee.

SCHOLARSHIP/STIPEND

The following Scholarship/Stipends are available:

- (a) Merit Scholarship for Diploma/ B. Pharm: Student-Merit scholarship upto 50% of the sanctioned strength of the

students in Diploma 2nd year and B. Pharm, 2nd, 3rd and 4th year of B. Pharm courses are awarded at the rate of Rs. 75/- p.m. The awards are governed by the relevant rules in force from time to time. Note: The student who is awarded merit/merit-cum-means scholarship shall have to execute the prescribed bond.

- (b) National Loan Scholarship: those students who have secured more than 60% marks can submit their application through the Director of the institution, to the Directorate of Education for the award of National Loan Scholarship.

LATE FEE FINE

If the dues (other than those payable at the time of admission) are not paid by the due date, late payment fine of rupees one hundred for each day after the due date (including holidays) shall be realized, subject to a maximum of Rs.3000/- only.

If the fees is not paid within thirty days after the due date (including holidays) for any reason whatsoever, the name of the defaulter student shall be struck off the rolls of the institute without any notice.

PAYMENTS OF FINES AND DUES

Students shall pay on demand any fine imposed on them or the cost of any damage to or loss of library books, equipment or other property of the institute.

On failure to do so the same will be recovered from the caution money which shall be reimbursed by the student within the time specified by the Dean. If the cost of any damage to be recovered or loss exceeds the amount of caution money the

balances shall be deposited by the student on demand by the Dean. Failure to do so, may result in the removal of the name from the rolls of the Institute.

The students shall clear all dues to the institute before they are permitted to appear in the final examination. If the dues are not cleared, their admit card/ provisional certificates /Diploma will be withheld.

STRIKING OFF ROLLS

The name of the student may be struck off the rolls on account of:

- (i) His own written request, endorsed by his parent/guardian;
- (ii) Continued absence without obtaining leave for **FIVE** consecutive working days;
- (iii) Irregular attendance and poor progress in studies;
- (iv) If ordered to be **EXPELLED** or **RUSTICATED** from the institute;
- (v) Non-payment of tuition fee and other dues for 30 days after the last date of payment. The Director, Dean, Students Affairs, however, may grant not more than 30 days of grace period in deserving cases on application by the parent/guardian.

Eligibility for Appearing in the Annual Examination

Only students securing 75% attendance or above in both theory and practical classes taken separately are allowed to appear in the annual examination.

RE-ADMISSION

On payment of re-admission fee of Rs. 500/- along with the dues and penalty, re-admission can be considered at the discretion of Director only in deserving cases.

DISCIPLINE

All the students admitted to the Institute will be under the complete disciplinary control of the Director of the Institute or any other officer(s) appointed by him for the purpose and must conduct themselves in accordance with the disciplinary rules of the Institute as framed and notified by the Director

RAGGING

In accordance with the order of the Hon'ble Supreme Court dated 10.12.2007, in the Special Leave to Appeal (Civil)NOS 24295 and 24296-99 of 2004, "if any incident of ragging comes to the notice of the authority, the concerned student shall be given liberty to explain and if his explanation is not found satisfactory, the authority would expel him from the institution." The Anti-Ragging Nodal Officer of the Institute is Dr. P.K. Sahoo, Dean, Students' Affairs.

The candidates seeking admission have to give an undertaking that they will abide by the rules and regulations prescribed and abide by an action taken in this regard against students by the Director.

Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of Institute as well as on public transport.

- (c) violate the status, dignity and honor of students belonging to the scheduled castes and tribes;
- (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self esteem;
- (e) entrain verbal and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behavior.

B.Pharm course Examination (4 Year)

The duration of the course shall be four years

Examination

1st Year: Every student seeking admission to the examination to be held at the end of the first academic year must have pursued a regular course of study for one academic year.

2nd Year: Every student seeking admission to the examination to be held at the end of the second academic year must have passed the 1st year examination and must have pursued thereafter a regular course of study for one academic year.

3rd Year: Every student seeking admission to the examination to be held at the end of the third academic year must have passed the 2nd year examination and must have pursued thereafter a regular course of study for one academic year.

4th Year: Every student seeking admission to the examination to be held at the end of the fourth academic year must have passed the 3rd year examination and must have pursued thereafter a regular course of study for one academic year.

Supplementary Examination:

A candidate who fails to appear at the annual examination or having appeared in the annual examination fails to pass the same in one or more subjects, as prescribed for the examination, may be allowed to appear in the remaining subjects, at the supplementary.

On the result of the supplementary examination, a candidate who has secured at least 50% marks in the aggregate, but has secured less than 50% marks in not more than one subject (separately in the theory, practical, sessionals) may be promoted to the next higher class and be permitted to appear at the examination in that subject of the previous year to which thus promoted, provided that no candidate of the category shall be allowed to proceed to the next higher class unless he/she has passed the previous year examination from which she/he has carried over a subject as specified above.

Minimum Pass Marks

The minimum marks to pass the examination at the end of each year shall be 50% in the theory paper, and 50% in the practical including oral where provided taken together in each subject and 50% marks in the study tour as also 50% marks in the aggregate of the year.

Classification of successful candidates

There shall be no classification division in respect of successful

candidates in the I B. Pharm examination. The students who have passed this examination securing 75% of the marks in the aggregate shall be treated to have passed the examination with honor; candidates securing 75% of the marks in any subject shall be treated to have distinction in the particular subject they pass the examination in one attempt.

The result of the successful candidates of the course shall be classified at the end of the final year examination on the basis of the aggregate of all Subject theory & Practical secured by the candidate in the II, III & IV year examination, taken together as indicated below:

First Divison 60% and above

Second Divison 50% and above but below 60%

Distinction: Candidate securing 75% of marks or above in any subject or subjects shall be declared to have obtained distinction in that subject or subjects, provided the candidate passes in all the subjects in the same examination.

The candidate will retain the internal assessment of the previous examination.

The candidate who fails to pass or fail to qualify for promotion to the next higher class on the result of a supplementary examination shall be required to rejoin the college in the same class as a regular student and pursue fresh studies for the another academic year in the subjects in which he/she could not secure the minimum pass marks at the last examination.

Candidate must pass the 1 year examination two year of their admission to the course.

Candidate must pass the final year examination within seven year of their admission to the 1 year of the course.
